The Co-operative University of Kenya has once again affirmed its place among the nation's best-run institutions. In the FY 2024/2025 Performance Evaluation results released at the Productivity and Performance Conference held at the Kenya School of Government, Lower Kabete, from 17th to 19th June 2026, CUK was ranked 3rd among Public Universities and 7th overall among all State Corporations in Kenya; a composite score of 2.2147 that places us firmly among the Top 10 performers for the second year running.

The conference was graced by H.E. Dr. William Samoei Ruto, President of the Republic of Kenya, and Prime Cabinet Secretary Hon. Musalia Mudavadi, underscoring

the national significance attached to public sector productivity. We further celebrate our partner, the Ministry of Co-operatives & MSMEs Development, which emerged Position 1 as Best Improved Ministry, a shared triumph for the entire Cooperative Movement.

As **Paul J. Meyer** notes, *"Productivity is never an accident. It is always the result of a commitment to excellence, intelligent planning, and focused effort,"* this ranking is exactly that: no accident. During the morning session of the 2026 Annual Vice Chancellor's Forum, [The Co-operative University of Kenya](#) underscored its commitment to service excellence through a staff sensitization on Customer Centricity and the Open-Door Policy facilitated by [Ms. Anita Kivulu](#) from the [Institute of Certified Secretaries \(ICS\)](#). The engaging session equipped members of staff with practical insights into a cultural alignment strategy that shifts institutional focus from internal processes to customer needs while fostering transparent communication across all levels of the University. The training reinforced CUK's aspiration of attaining a Customer Satisfaction Index of 0.92 by the conclusion of the [2022–2027 Strategic Plan](#) period, underscoring the University's resolve to cultivate a responsive, customer-focused and service-oriented institutional culture.

Following the sensitization session, staff members proceeded to the University's Graduation Square for a series of team-building activities aimed at strengthening collaboration, communication, and workplace synergy. The interactive exercises provided an opportunity for employees from different departments to build trust, enhance problem-solving skills, and reinforce the spirit of

teamwork that continues to drive institutional excellence at CUK. The activities reflected the University's belief that a united workforce is fundamental to delivering exceptional service to students, partners, and other stakeholders.

The afternoon celebrations culminated in the Annual Vice Chancellor's Address and Award session for the Best Performed Staff and Departments during the 2024/2025 Performance Appraisal cycle, where the University community celebrated outstanding achievements recorded at the National Productivity and Performance Awards that took place from 17th to 19th June 2026 at the Kenya School of Government (Nairobi). The event, presided over by President William Ruto, honoured government ministries and state institutions for their productivity and service

delivery. CUK ranked the University third (3rd) among Kenya's public universities and seventh among State Corporations. The Forum also provided an opportunity to reflect on the milestones achieved during the 2025/2026 Financial Year while charting a bold course for the 2026/2027 Financial Year.

During the Vice Chancellor's address, [Prof. Kamau Ngamau](#) led the University in celebrating significant institutional milestones, including the continued implementation of the Chancellor's Legacy Programme, progress in constructing the 2,520-bed student hostel under the Affordable Housing Programme, the launch of the CUK Endowment Fund, approval of the Roof-to-Power Project, and the Government's approval for the establishment of the African Horticultural Centre. Further, the VC's Forum highlighted ongoing implementation of the [Strategic Plan 2022–2027](#), curriculum alignment with the Competency-Based Curriculum, and expansion of academic programmes through four newly approved bachelor's degrees. Notably, Prof. Ngamau singled out notable student achievements in innovation, ICT, sports, and creative arts, and the University's continued commitment to staff recognition, professional development, financial sustainability, and customer-centred service delivery.

The Co-operative University of Kenya's marketing team was honoured to have participated in the Bizlink Trade Expo (BTEXPO) 2026 – Eldoret City Edition, held at Eldoret Sports Club from 25th to 27th June. During this fourth annual expo, businesses, entrepreneurs, and industry stakeholders across multiple sectors. Our involvement was fully in line with our Strategic Plan 2022–2027 (especially the focus on customer-centricity and brand visibility). Our Marketing Team interacted with prospective students and business stakeholders, highlighting the market-driven academic programs offered at the University.

During the first day of the Expo, we were privileged to host Hon. Dr. Philip Zeal Chebunet, the County Executive Committee Member (CECM) for Trade, Industrialization, Tourism, Co-operatives, and Enterprise Development in the County Government of Uasin Gishu, at our exhibition stand. The visit provided an opportunity to showcase our market-driven academic programmes and discuss the University's role in supporting the County's industrialization, cooperative development, enterprise growth, and human capital development agenda. We appreciated the engagement and reaffirmed our commitment to strengthening partnerships that advance innovation, skills

development, and sustainable socio-economic transformation in the North Rift region and beyond.

Ms. Lilian Nkatha, the University's Marketing Officer, explained to the County Officials and attendees that the expo served as a market linkage and investment platform, bringing together financial and academic institutions, producers, manufacturers, buyers, exporters and policymakers to unlock trade opportunities within Uasin Gishu County and beyond. Our participation was intended to raise the University's profile in the high-growth North Rift economy while supporting the county's industrial agenda. Our goals at BTEXPO included positioning our brand in the region's emerging market ecosystem; engaging directly with SMEs, cooperatives and exporters; accessing new partnerships; and aligning our programs with county and national industrial priorities.

The turnout at BTEXPO was impressive, attracting over 100 leads and 17 applicants in different academic programmes and levels. The event was co-hosted by the Uasin Gishu County Government's Department of Trade, Tourism and Cooperatives, underscoring the region's focus on industry-led growth. Uasin Gishu is widely recognized as one of Kenya's leading economic hubs and agricultural heartlands, home to major manufacturers like Rivatex and Ken-Knit. County leaders explained that this expo aligned with their push for value-addition and export readiness. Governor Jonathan Bii noted that the county is well prepared to put into use the County Aggregation and Industrial Park (CAIP) and the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) once construction is completed. The County Sheriff emphasized that these projects are backed by a Ksh. 500 million

national investment and abundant raw materials such as horticulture, coffee, avocado, dairy, etc.), to raise the County's manufacturing output from about 7% of GDP towards 15%. BTEXPO 2026 thus provided a crucial forum to advance these county priorities by connecting producers, buyers and investors, which aligned with CUK's mandate in the co-operative sector.

At our exhibition stand, we made sure to connect the University's strengths with the expo's theme. [The Co-operative University of Kenya](#) showcased our specialized courses in agribusiness, cooperative management, data science and related fields – programs designed to meet the region's demand for skilled professionals. Attendees spoke with our officers about research

collaborations, partnerships, and training for local cooperatives. Importantly, CUK's Team emphasized how the University's curriculum can directly support local industries, for example, by providing trained agronomists, food technologists and business managers for the CAIP's agribusiness ventures. In this way, our participation was not just promotional; it was an active partnership in the county's economic development vision.

The University has been following up on integrating industry feedback into our future course development and collaborating further with the County's trade and cooperative offices on training workshops on value-chain development through the [Institute of Co-operative Development](#).

Ultimately, BTEXPO 2026 elevated our profile and reinforced that education and enterprise thrive together. The institution continues to engage in this and similar forums, confident that bringing education and industry face-to-face is key to empowering communities and growing Kenya's economy.
